Dismissal Arrangements

Please take note of our systems for dismissing children:

- Children from Nursery to Year 4 should be collected from school by an adult. This adult should be known to the child and school.
- For children in Year 5 and Year 6 parents/ carers should decide how they would like their child to be dismissed, to an identified adult or to walk home on their own. If your child is in Year 5 or Year 6 and you wish them to walk home on their own, this should have been documented with the class teacher.
- If a child is being collected by anyone other than the parent / carer and is to leave school with another adult, parents / carers should inform the class teacher **in writing**. For example if a group of children are being collected by another parent for a party or sleepover, the class teacher must have written permission. The person collecting your child should also be advised of which door your child will come through and which class they are in. A copy of the dismissal arrangement slip is included in your child's Welcome Pack which you can use to inform the school of a change to arrangements. Additional copies are available from the office. For safeguarding reasons the office are unable to accept verbal consent.

If your child attends an after school club, the club must have written permission for the child to attend the club and a written agreement as to how the child is to be dismissed after the club.

Please Remember

The children have come back to school mostly in correct uniform and with the equipment they need for the new term. Just a few reminders:

Jewelry is not allowed in school. If there is a particular reason for jewelry, especially earrings please talk to the class teacher. We make this decision based on safety and also to avoid upset if things are lost.

Snack should be healthy - no sweets, crisps or chocolate. Children are not allowed sweets in school for playtime. Treats for birthdays are usually given out at the end of the day to be brought home for parents to decide when they are eaten. Packed lunches should be healthy with no glass or cans and no fizzy drinks.

Jumpers, cardigans or sweatshirts should be red. This is the uniform colour, grey is not. While I appreciate money has already been spent on some children's grey jumpers and do not want to cause parents further expense - when they are due for replacement, they must be red. School has a uniform and this should be respected and kept to as all rules and requirements for school to run smoothly and fairly for all children.

Children in Reception need a pair of wellies in school, with their name on so that they can play outside in the EYFS outdoor area. They also need snack money please of £1 a week to fund snack and cooking or baking.

Birthday Cakes

While we really appreciate the kindness of parents sending cakes into school for a birthday, and while we enjoy celebrating birthdays with children. We do not always have enough staff on duty to cut and wrap the number of cakes we often receive in a day. If you would like to share something with your child's class to celebrate birthdays, please send individual items in such as single cupcakes per child or a small bag of treats. We do not want to discourage celebration, but would appreciate your support in making these celebrations manageable in class.
