Why is the church a special place for Christians?

Christian Concepts:

PEOPLE OF GOD: People chosen by God. Because sin entered the world (The Fall), God hoped that his relationship with his special people would bring all people back to him and reverse the effect of the Fall. The Old Testament tells of the ups and downs of this journey.

GOSPEL: Christians believe Jesus' incarnation is 'good news' for all people. ('Gospel' means 'good news.') Jesus' example and teaching emphasise loving one's neighbour as part of loving God.

KINGDOM OF GOD: God's ideal for human life in the world - a vision of life lived in the way God intended for human beings, following Jesus' example, inspired and empowered by God's Spirit.

Key Vocabulary:

Church: building for Christian worship/a group of Christians.

Vicar/Minister: The leader of a Christian Church

Pews: Wooden seats inside a church.

Font: container for holding the water for baptism

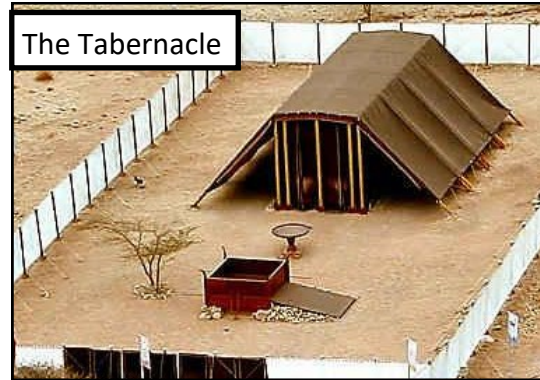
Altar: Holy table at the front of Church
