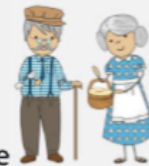

Phonics & Pronunciation we will see:

Recommended phonics focus: I IN IQUE ILLE

- **IN** sound in **cinq & cinquante**
- **I** sound in **famille, Lisa, Jacqueline, petite & fille**
- **ILLE** sound in **famille & fille**
- **IQUE** sound in **unique**
- **Silent letters.** The final consonant ('s') is not pronounced in **appelles, ans, soeurs, mes grands-parents, les or parents.** Often happens in French.
- **Elision** in **je m'appelle/il s'appelle/elle s'appelle/j'ai.** This is generally in order to facilitate pronunciation in French. Dropping of the last letter of a word (as in the 'e' in me or je) replacing it with an apostrophe so attaching it to the word that follows that starts with a vowel or mute h.

quarante- forty

cinquante- fifty

soixante- sixty

soixante-dix- seventy

quatre-vingts- eighty

quatre-vingts-dix- ninety

cent- hundred
