



**Arable farming** involves growing crops such as wheat and barley rather than keeping animals or growing fruit and vegetables

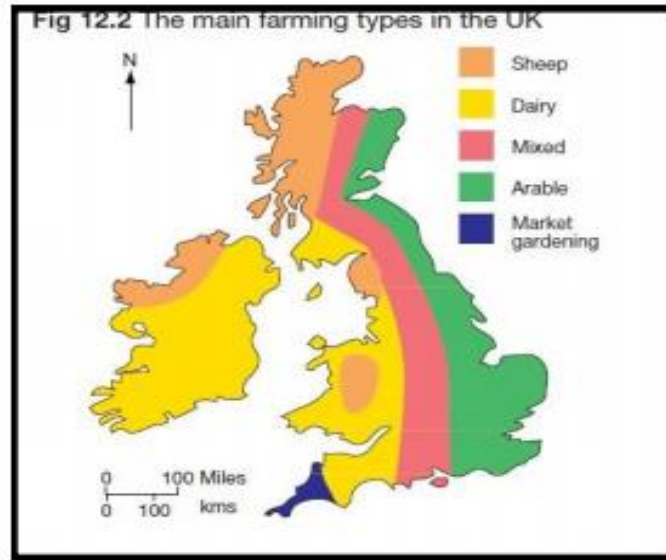


**Dairy farming** uses milk from animals to make cheese, yoghurt and butter.



**Livestock farming** animals are raised for meat, wool and eggs.

<b>Spring</b>	Baby animals are born.
<b>Summer</b>	Animals graze in the fields.
<b>Autumn</b>	The crops are harvested.
<b>Winter</b>	Animals stay inside out of the cold.

agriculture	farming and the methods that are used to raise and look after crops and animals.
biomes	a natural area of vegetation and animals
climate	the general weather conditions that are typical of it.
crop	plants such as wheat and potatoes that are grown in large quantities for food
distribute	providing a product to lots of different places.
farm	an area of land used to produce crops or to breed animals and livestock
harvest	the process of gathering crops
import	bringing goods into the country from another country.
organic	growing crops without using chemicals.
produce	food grown in large quantities to sell
season	main periods of the year that can have their own weather conditions
rural	places far away from large cities and towns
vegetation	plants, trees and flowers
