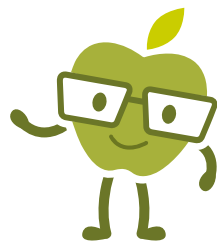


Collective worship

Biblical value: Wisdom
Key idea: Words have power



Pupil involvement

Squeeze a tube of toothpaste out onto a plate. Ask a volunteer to come and put the toothpaste back into the tube. You could offer them a spoon, cocktail stick or glue spreader to help! Explain that it is very tricky to do this. It seems once the toothpaste is out, it is very difficult to put it back in. The words we choose to use are like this. Once we have said something, we can't take it back.

We are all free and should be able to say what we like. We can challenge others and disagree with even the people in authority such as governments, political parties or our teachers but we must consider the consequences of our words. If you do not consider how what you say may impact others and you hurt someone's feelings or knock their confidence, then you have not chosen your words carefully or wisely or used your freedom responsibly.

Pupil talk

- How important do you think words are?
- Have you ever said something you wish you could take back? Perhaps when you were feeling angry or upset about something?
- Can you think of a time when words have had the power to damage/hurt you or encourage/enlighten you?
