<u>Unit 4.4: Exploring Easter as a story of betrayal and</u> trust.

Key Questions:

What is trust? How do we show trust? Who do we trust? Why? Why is trust important? Why did Judas betray Jesus? What does it mean to betray someone? How does it feel to be betrayed? What is forgiveness? Have you ever forgiven someone? Have you ever experienced being forgiven?

Christian Concepts:

<u>Salvation</u> (Jesus died in the place of people, so that anyone who believes and trusts in Him will be 'saved' or rescued from death and able to be in heaven with God for ever.)

Key Vocabulary:

Betrayal: Doing something harmful to a friend or another.
Forgiveness: When someone stops blaming or threatening punishment for something done wrong.
Gethsemane: A garden in the Kidron Valley, on the Mount of Olives.
Jerusalem: The capital city of Israel.
Judas: One of Jesus' 12 disciples; he betrayed Jesus.
Loyalty: Strong support; sticking by another.
Peter: One of Jesus' 12 disciples. He denied Jesus but was forgiven.
Trust: Confidence in the reliability of someone or something

Key Bible Verses:


