The best class attendance for the last half term was 2G with 97% and 6HB with 96.7%. Thank you for your support. They will receive class treats this week. Well done.

The minimum we expect for attendance is **97%, with excellent punctuality**. Thank you to all those many, many families and children who hold attendance as a high priority. We know you support your child and want the best for them. **We know that children are sometimes ill and we know that Covid can have a big impact on a child's attendance and we understand this.**

What we also know is that holidays during term time, appointments made during school hours and unnecessary absences make a difference to the child's attendance and hence interrupts learning and friendships. These unnecessary absences are things such as:

- Waking up late but staying off school all day instead of coming late.
- Attending a medical appointment in the morning, but not coming back to school afterwards.
- Attending a medical appointment in the afternoon but not coming into school for the morning session.
- Feeling unwell in the morning, feeling better by lunchtime, but not coming to school.
- Taking a Friday off when going away or the weekend 'to miss the traffic'.
- A late night leading to tiredness and absence the whole of the next day.
- Not attending if they have not completed homework and know they are missing some play time to complete the work.

### Messages to school

It is lovely to be able to share photograph and news via Dojo. We find it really easy to use and we know parents do too.

Just one reminder please – please don't ask questions in the comments section under a post, we may not always see it. Especially when the next post goes up as the post get pushed down and we don't necessarily return to a post once it has been pushed down the line.

If you want to ask a specific question – send a dojo message directly to the person you want to ask the question of so that it does not get lost in comments and you do not get frustrated thinking we have not replied.

It is also better to email school rather than phone if you want some specific questions or in-depth questions answering as teachers cannot come to the phone when teaching. Asking for a call back the same day may not always be possible, but leaving an email ensures it stays 'on the teacher's radar'.

- If you think something is unfair, how do you behave? Do you moan and complain? Is there a better way to react to unfairness?

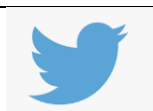
## Key stage 2 class discussion
