15 and 30 Hour Nursery Places Available for September 2022



When your child is 3 years old, they are eligible for a place in our Nursery from September 2022.

We offer 15 and 30 hour places. Our Nursery is run by qualified teachers and teaching assistants offering a programme of early childhood education and preparation for school based around the high quality EYFS approaches of exploration and child centred. (8.40 – 11.40 for 15 hours, 8.40 – 3.20 for 30 hours)

Breakfast club is available for Nursery children from 8.00am. This can be booked through the main school office. There are no hidden costs for the 30 hour offer. School staff cover the lunchtime, we just ask that you send in a packed lunch.

School provides snack for all children in the Nursery.
If you are not entitled to the 30 hour offer, but still wish your child to attend more than 15 hours, you can buy extra sessions on an ad hoc basis dependant on availability.

Come and visit us to see our school and meet our staff and children. Please contact the office to arrange a visit. We have recently had a confirmed judgement of 'Good' from Ofsted with a very positive report and lovely feedback.

We are running these 1.5 hour sessions in the following libraries:

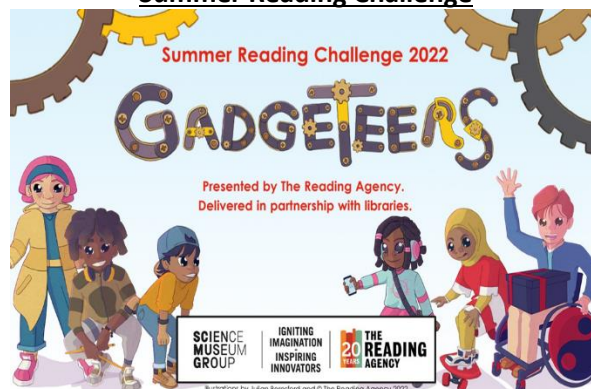

The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency and funded by Arts Council England, encourages children aged 4 to 11 to set themselves a reading challenge to help prevent the summer reading 'dip'. Each year the Summer Reading Challenge has a different theme. For 2022, The Reading Agency is partnering with Science Museum Group for Gadgets, a science and innovation themed Challenge that will spark children's curiosity about the world around them. This is a free, fun activity that can be completed during the summer holidays. Here they can explore books to read, earn reading badges and play games linked to recommended novels.
