




Message from Mrs Wade – School Nurse Drop In

The School Nurse will be holding a Drop In session on Wednesday 24th January between 2pm - 3pm. No appointment necessary.










Enrichment

Let's look at this week's story

A study from the University of Valencia, in Spain, found that print reading could boost skills by six to eight times more than digital reading, for example, on an e-reader or tablet. The study, published in the Review of Educational Research, also found that while there is a negative relationship between digital reading and comprehension for primary school pupils, the relationship turns positive for secondary school-aged


pupils.
